A dual concept dedicated to comfort of use and functionality

Organised into two symmetrically opposed volumes, the Pepper and Spicy complex features a bioclimatic double-facade equipped with walkways wrapping around each floor. These external spaces, which offer users a view of the environment and the green heart of the block while linking the buildings, also support the sunbreakers to provide spaces that combine comfort and energy efficiency.

Reflecting new ways of working, the flexible and adaptable office spaces alternate between open and shared areas, encouraging exchanges and collaboration, and more enclosed areas conducive to confidentiality and concentration.

With well-being and social interaction at the core of this engaging project, particular attention has been paid to the concept of the 'social alley': Our teams have come up with places to relax and meet, all designed differently and tailormade for each department, with the aim of enabling employees and visitors to share convivial moments and enjoy a cup of coffee, or play a game of pool or pinball in one of the games areas.


